

NASSAU COUNTY PAL CODE OF CONDUCT

Nassau County P.A.L. Youth Lacrosse League

It is the Responsibility of all Communities, Lacrosse Organizations, Directors and Coaches in the P.A.L. Youth Lacrosse League to endorse and implement the following concepts. This form must be signed by the Director of each town and be submitted at registration:

1. This Code of Conduct will be shared with Directors, Coaches, Players and Spectators in all P.A.L. Lacrosse communities and organizations and all organizations participating in the P.A.L. Youth Lacrosse League must abide by these rules.
2. All organizations are asked to post this Code of Conduct and have a copy at the scorer's table at all games.
3. Organizations playing in P.A.L. Youth Lacrosse programs will be held responsible for the conduct of their Players, Directors, Coaches and Spectators.
4. Organizations must provide adequate supervision at all P.A.L. Youth Lacrosse games.
5. It is the responsibility of each lacrosse organization to make sure that all of their players are from their school district. Players need advance written permission from the Directors of both communities to switch to and play in another town.
6. Unless the League Board approves it in advance, players are not permitted to simultaneously play on two P.A.L. Youth Lacrosse League teams. Exceptions will generally be granted to allow very large rosters to be broken up to maximize playing time for the players. For example, a program with 28 players in one grade may have three players on two rosters to get two rosters of 17 players each.
7. 2nd graders cannot play up. 6th graders cannot play up. NO player can play down.
8. No one will be on the sidelines of any game unless they are visibly wearing a current/valid ID badge issued by NCPALYLL.
9. It is the responsibility of all Directors to report any infractions of NCPAL rules and any other inappropriate conduct to the NCPAL Youth Lacrosse League Ethics Committee. If a violation of rules occurs at an event, it is the responsibility of **both** of the organizations participating in the event to report it and not just the Director of the home team.
10. This Code of Conduct must be signed and dated by all Directors.
11. All organizations will have and maintain in place sufficient insurance to cover all players, Coaches and Directors and the insurance policy will name NCPAL as an additional insured.
